Job Title: Permanent Full-Time – Registered Practical Nurse/Registered Nurse Position

Mino M'shki-ki is a newly developing Indigenous Interprofessional Primary Care Access team that has care teams operating in New Liskeard and Kirkland Lake Ontario. The Mino M'shki-ki Indigenous Health Team is mandated to take a culturally-rooted approach informed by local Indigenous Traditional Knowledge, languages and cultural practices in its work with families and communities. A commitment to personal leadership, cultural competency and service excellence is a requirement of this position.

Duties Include:

- o Utilizes the teachings of the Medicine Wheel to ensure a holistic approach to care delivery
- o Provides flexible, holistic and culturally sensitive health services to Indigenous clients and the community to achieve better health outcomes and better access to health services for Indigenous people.
- o Ensures cultural security and safety
- o Effectively functions as a member of our interprofessional health team (including Physicians, Traditional Healers/Therapists, Diabetes Program, and other nurses)
- o Provides health education and counselling related to health issues identified (i.e. mental health, family planning and medication adherence)
- o Promotes health lifestyles and self-management with chronic illness
- Consults and works collaboratively with other Health Care Providers in providing excellence in client care using evidence-based practice
- Maintains documentation standards in the electronic medical record
- Operates within his/her full scope of practice
- o Provides basic, advanced and diabetic foot care

Qualifications:

- Completion of an accredited Registered Practical Nurse Program or Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing
- Current registration in good standing with the College of Nurses of Ontario
- Experience working with electronic health record considered an asset
- 2 years of related/applicable experience in a Community or Primary Care setting working with Indigenous Clientele

- Strong knowledge of Indigenous history, cultural teachings, protocols, and ceremonies
- o Enthusiastic, knowledgeable and passionate about Indigenous culture
- Excellent problem-solving ability with sound judgment
- o Exceptional verbal and written communication skills
- Strong interpersonal skills with the ability to create a supportive and positive environment for staff and volunteers
