Item #2 – Northern Sun Mining Presentation	
Lead(s):	Tim Doskotch, Sarah Marazzo, Rui Coutu
Discussion:	Their team came to discuss the proposed Redstone Mill Tailings Pond expansion.
	The Redstone Mill is located 30km Southeast of Timmins and has been in operation since 2009
	(previously under Liberty Mines).
	The current tailings pond design has a limited lifespan of two years at a rate of 800 tonnes/day.
	They are looking to raise two dams and a perimeter of existing dams to a maximum of 316m (total of
	8m above ground level) to be raised in two 4m stages. The HDPE liner from the existing TSF is to be
	extended.
	Discharge rate into the Redstone River will vary from 450 m ³ /day to 1,170m ³ /day.
	They would like a letter of support from Chief and Council for the project.
	Councilor mention that our First Nation will always have concerns regarding tailings because what
	has happened here in the past. Communication between the First Nation and Northern Sun needs
	to be better and timely especially regarding any issues/spills that may arise.
	Councilor also mentioned looking to have a meeting with Chief and Council to go over all mining
	requests and issues mid-August.
	Band Member voiced concerns of the possibility of a spill/seepage from the tailings pond as it will
	flow through Nighthawk Lake and all the way up to the coast. He would like Chief and Council to
	remember that unlike forestry, the land never really recovers from mining activity.

Item #3 – Wakenagan Youth Treatment Centre	
Lead(s):	Shawn Moore, Naomi Fletcher
Discussion:	Wakenagun is a youth healing lodge that works in partnership with Ka-NaChi-Hih Specialized Solvent Abuse Treatment Center in Thunder Bay and NAN.
	 12–17-year-old, 12-week live-in healing lodge for youth struggling with Mental Health and Addictions
	First intake was in January 2022.
	 A voluntary detox process is started at intake phase and clients need to be substance free for 72 hours prior to being admitted.
	 Chief mentioned there should be 2 rooms put aside for immediate/emergency issues. (Response was it would be a great idea, but they can't as of right now.)
	 Each location has 4 intakes per year with individualized treatment plans and after care goals. Take people from NAN territory first. Utilize services/elder/knowledge keepers from the area.
	 Offer pre-treatment for those waiting to get in and post-treatment for a minimum of 3 months including a 4 phase Stabilization Education Healing Transition
	 Have a Clinical Lead for various counselling/mental health services.
	• Outcomes are measured by surveys and Red Path sessions as well as reporting pieces.
	• They are not sure but believe they have a 60-40 for success-relapse rate.

Item #4 – Agnico Eagle Update

Lead(s): Discussion:	 Charles Miller Macassa is at least 80 years old. Since the purchase of AE – things are going better than with KL Gold 4 employees at AE Macassa with at least one band member waiting for a start date. There is a lack of resources for induction/safety training. This IBA does not really recognize joint ventures unless 51% indigenous owned. 3 diamond drills at Macassa MFNLP has the janitorial services The environmental committee meets every 3 months Each community gets 2.5% of royalties (2nd last page of presentation) . Taylor is capped and everything goes out of Holt. So far for this year we've made the same royalty payments as all of last year. Milling is at capacity in Kirkland Lake and they will be taking ore from AK (Amalgamated Kirkland) property to Quebec. We are working on incorporating the AK into the IBA. Looking at doing a tour at Macassa for tailings site and Kinross fish habitat as well as Macassa proper and AK property. HR does not always inform Charles when a FN member applies.

Discussion:	MFN has submitted to the gov't our intent to make our own laws.
	We now need to apply for capacity funding which would be 2–4-year plan and it would be good to
	hire a new person to do the legwork required to develop and coordinate the program. (OKT had
	agreed a year ½ ago to take on MFN to help through this process as well).
	The previous committee needs to be updated.
	Have a good amount of information completed but need the coordination part which includes meeting with members to gather experiences/views.
	• Funding of \$250,000 annually is available until our Laws are in place up to 2026. We are ½ year ahead of schedule. A complete budget is in the works.
	Can we hire a coordinator in a contract role depending on funding? Hiring a member vs. a consultant would be preferred and it does not have to be someone working in child welfare.
	Post Majority care information was shared regarding youth 18 to 26 who have been in care at some point.
	 Currently Stacy is working on a case-by-case basis and will be applying for individual needs. Along with post-majority care is more funding which means we can eventually hire a worker whose sole job would be to travel and find these members and provide help.
