Discussion:	<ul> <li>There is a Matachewan First Nation Youth-13 team participating in Little NHL this year with 5 of our Band Members on it.</li> <li>Agnico Eagle donated some money that was used for entrance fees, socks, and jerseys.</li> <li>The team also received funding from Jordan's Principle for lodging, meals, and travel.</li> <li>They fundraised to get sweaters and jackets themselves.</li> <li>Jerseys will be returned to the Band after the tournament for future use (11 team members).</li> <li>The Chief and 3 Councilors will be going to little NHL this year so they can help set things up for the following years.</li> <li>MFN branded merchandise may be ordered if members want. Send any requests to Stan Fox.</li> <li>Hoodies - \$60, Spring Jacket \$60 – Jersey at least \$110</li> </ul>

Item #4 – Accel	Item #4 – Accelerated High Speed Internet	
Lead(s):	Mike Smith, Stephanie Saleh, Chris MacKay (Infrastructure Ontario)	
Discussion:	<ul> <li>The Ministry of Infrastructure has a mandate to have High Speed Internet to all communities in Ontario by 2025.</li> <li>They are requesting background information regarding the number of home/businesses being serviced on the First Nation (including GIS information), how we are serviced currently, how we would like to have service in the future (fiber optics/satellite), and our main providers. This will help them create a plan to ensure all homes have access to higher speed internet (minimum 50 download/10 upload speeds).</li> <li>It was suggested we have our Housing Intern reach out to community members with a survey to gather opinions. The final plan would depend on what would be viable to complete.</li> <li>Costs for internet would be similar to what urban areas pay for services, and if fiber optic connection is not viable, they are looking at having a satellite subsidy program in the future to offset costs.</li> <li>There is not a deadline for this to be completed, but the Ministry would like to have all projects</li> </ul>
